2017-18 TUITION SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

FOR INCOMING FRESHMAN ONLY

INFORMATION SHEET AND APPLICATION GUIDELINES

The School of Art and Design offers a limited number of Tuition Scholarships and partial tuition scholarships for talented incoming freshmen art majors. The Scholarships can ONLY be applied to tuition and CANNOT be used to pay other fees. Recipients are responsible for any balance of tuition and all assessed fees. Students who are awarded this scholarship and maintain the 12-hour minimum course load, as well as continue to meet the criteria listed below, are eligible to hold this scholarship for a maximum of two years when funds are available. Scholarship benefits may not be applied to tuition for summer terms.

In order to receive and maintain a scholarship, a recipient must enroll in and complete a minimum of 12 semester hours, including courses appropriate to the art major and selected emphasis <u>each semester</u>, and meet the following criteria:

- a. Must have applied and been accepted to NIU based on meeting or surpassing the minimum freshman admission criteria as published in NIU's *Undergraduate Catalog*.
- b. Maintain a minimum 2.0 overall grade point average.
- c. Maintain a minimum 3.0 overall grade point average in art courses.

THE APPLICATION AND PORTFOLIO SUBMISSION IS A TWO-STEP PROCESS

- The first round is a digital submission of artwork that will be reviewed by a Scholarship Committee which selects the portfolios for the final round for consideration.
- The final round is used as a follow up for additional documents if it is needed.

SUBMISSION PROCESS:

- Submit scholarship application. An application form is attached within this packet and may be duplicated for additional copies.
- Submit a digital portfolio with <u>ONLY 10 pieces of artwork on a flash drive, CD or DVD media disc.</u> Submitted works may be from one or more of the following categories: drawing, painting, photography, jewelry, sculpture, ceramics, illustration, video, animation, digital interactive work, fiber, graphic design, and printmaking. For 3-dimensional or large work, such as a mural or installation, you may submit four views of the piece. If all work is **3D or large in scale**, a total of no more than 40 images may be submitted.

Instructions for Digital Portfolio:

- Portfolios must be submitted on a recordable flash drive, or CD/DVD in a jewel or other protective case that can
 withstand shipping in the US mail. The flash drive or disc media should be clearly labeled with applicant's NAME,
 NUMBER of WORKS and CLASSIFICATION of work (e.g. Sculpture, ceramics, painting, drawing, etc.) The discs will
 not be returned to the applicant but will become property of the School of Art and Design.
- Include all portfolio JPEGs in their own file folder on a single flash drive, or CD/DVD. (See below for image formatting instructions.)
- Include any other documents in a separate file folder on the same flash drive, or CD/DVD.
- MUST include a digital image list as an 8.5"x11" Word document listing the title/description, medium, year, and size of each artwork in the portfolio; identifying each artwork on the list with the same number as the JPEG filename. *Optional: A digital copy of the image list can be provided as well in an additional file folder on the same flash drive, or CD/DVD.
- Three-dimensional work may require multiple views, no more than four images per piece of art may be submitted, label each slide indicating that it is the same piece. If all work is 3D, a total of 40 images may be submitted.
- **Optional:** can include a "contact sheet" with small (approximately 1"x1") printed color thumbnail images of the JPEG files (these printed images assist when identifying your artwork, but do not substitute for the JPEG files).

For static imagery:

- File Format: **JPEG file format only**, any other format will disqualify the applicant from consideration.
- Resolution: 72 dpi.
- File Size: no larger than 2.0 MB or 9 inches on the longest side approximately 700 x 700 pixels.
- File Name: identify each image with your last name and number. For example: sailer001.jpg, sailer002.jpg, sailer003.jpg . . .

Animation, motion-based or interactive media:

 An explanation sheet, including the description of the computer generated art, software and hardware used, and any additional instructions for accessing the images, must accompany the application. Files submitted on a flash drive or CD/DVD that do not open will be disqualified from the evaluation.

Art History Submissions:

- Applicants must provide relevant application materials that demonstrate a genuine commitment to the discipline of art history.
- Applicants should submit examples of scholarship; a minimum of two research papers, each approximately five pages in length.

Suggestions for producing digital images:

Use a 6 MP (mega pixel) or higher camera and if using auto focus, make sure that the artwork is clear, sharp and in focus. It is important that the slide reflects the original's color, sharpness, and values (exposure); be sure to set the proper camera exposure and "White Balance" for the lighting conditions (consult your camera manual). It is also important to eliminate distracting backgrounds by filling the viewfinder as much as possible with the artwork (but not cropping the artwork) and by using a solid neutral cloth or wall. Make final edits in a photo editing program.
